



AVTAA Plagiarism Affidavit

Plagiarism is offering someone else's ideas, words, or concepts as your own.

The AVTAA case reports should be written by you and in your own words. Importing verbatim sentence, paragraph, organizational structure, or copying the writing style of a source using a source's line of logic, thesis or ideas is considered plagiarism.

To ensure plagiarism is avoided, the AVTAA strongly recommends utilizing a program that will check your case reports to ensure no plagiarism is detected. Examples of free websites include:

Should evidence of plagiarism be found in your application it will result in immediate rejection of the complete application. In addition, a 5-year ban for applying to AVTAA will be imposed.

If after this grace period, upon reapplying, a second infraction is found, then a lifetime ban will occur.

By signing this document, you, the applicant, acknowledge that you understand the nuances involved in plagiarism, ways to avoid it and the penalty enforced by AVTAA should it occur.
